Pastoral Presence/Contact Now that we have begun our programmatic year, our staff office hours have returned to our normal 94, Monday - Friday schedule. As always, your pastors are on-call 24/7

to visit or talk to or meet with you as

needed. The best way to meet a Pastor is by

emailing, texting, or calling to schedule an appointment.

Pastor Seth and Pastor Peter will be out in the community, doing the work to which they're called, which means they'll be in and out of the office as they meet with groups, visit members and prospective members, and attend events throughout the whole week. Always CALL in a crisis or emergency.

Transition Process Update

The Transition Team is continuing its work each Monday evening. We're working through your thoughts, ideas, hopes, and dreams for Our Savior's, categorized into major themes such as Worship and Music, Youth and Family, Outreach, Education, and Finance.

Thank you to the 110 of you who have already engaged the process through individual meetings or the 19 public listening sessions. You can still participate in the process by speaking to Pastor Peter in person, on email, a letter, text, or phone call. The more information that the Team has to review, the better the result for the congregation.

From here, the Team will continue weekly work together and share preliminary findings with the Finance Committee and the Church Council at their October meetings. Then, the congregation will have an opportunity to hear those findings at public meetings in November (Nov. 6th at 2 pm, Nov. 7th at 7 pm, Nov. 12th at 11 am and 7 pm).

You have been great in this process, and thank you very much for welcoming me and trusting me to walk with you through this discernment for the future of the congregation.

A Note from OSLC's Treasurer:

The 2024 Giving Budget is \$668,500 and as of August 60% has been raised. The 2024 Expenditure Budget is \$729,300 and as of August 61% has been spent. The Cash Flow was a negative \$10,000 as of the end of August and Year-to-date of a negative \$7,000.

Sunshine Supper

OSLC hosts the free Sunshine Supper at Sunshine Place in Sun Prairie four times a year with the next one scheduled for Monday, November 18, 2024.

OSLC provides taco salads using 150 pounds of taco meat (cooked the day of the event), taco chips, lettuce, onions, black olives, shredded cheese, salsa, sour cream and applesauce, serving 475 to 500 meals. The meals are served on a drive-through basis instead of a sit-down meal, which would serve only 125. The issue of food insecurity is too great in our community to return to the sit-down method. The taco salad is a favorite in the community and the Sunshine Supper Team definitely likes it when OSLC is serving the meal.

There are currently 17 volunteers but more help is needed. There is a sign-up sheet left at the Welcome Desk three weeks prior to the event if you are interested in volunteering. If you would like to contribute financially you can write a check to Our Savior's Lutheran Church and put Sunshine Supper in the memo line.



2024 Update from the OSLC Quilters

OSLC Quilters report that a total of 191 quilts were completed and are on their way for Lutheran World Relief. They will provide warmth and comfort worldwide in places of need. Thanks to the many folks who helped fold and pack the quilts. It really made the annual project easier for us. We especially want to thank Mary and Alan Meyer and Donna and Dave Kallstrom for once again transporting the 50 boxes of quilts to the railroad station for the boxcar loading in Madison.



In addition, 12 quilts were given to the Bed Lady project at Sunshine Place. This project provides free beds to school aged children who otherwise may be sleeping on the floor in the Sun Prairie and Marshall school districts. Also, six kid-themed quilters were given to our partnered school, C. H. Bird School, for children who may need extra warmth and comforting.

Thanks to everyone for keeping the quilters in mind as you come across any fabric or materials to donate. Gently used print or colored sheets are always welcome. Any donations may be brought to church and will be taken upstairs to our quilting area. You're always welcome to come see us Wednesday mornings, from 900–11:00 am. Many thanks also for your prayers and support as we continue in this fellowship and ministry for LWR. We welcome anyone who would like to join us Wednesday mornings from 9:00–11:00. The Sun Prairie Wisconsin Days for Girls team met August 28th and packed 103 menstrual kits that will soon be on their way to women and girls in South Sudan. Since May of 2019 when our group began, we provided 1568 full kits and 1100 other sewn parts through Days for Girls. While our group is not an official part of Our Savior's, many of our members are and the support we receive from OSLC is essential to what we do. In addition to providing space for our sewing days, Our Savior's has given us Thrivent grants in the past and does the record keeping for donations and expenses.
