From Pastor Hecox

My fellow Our Saviorians,

Sorry, I got caught up in the language of recent events, haha. It is nice to greet you again as our summer adventures start to wrap up.

I write to you from the cozy confines of a basement in which I've confined myself. A positive covid test has required me to isolate for a few days, and will do the same to some other members of our ELCA Youth Gathering contingent. The trip went great, even if the (mild) sickness in the aftermath is not so fun.

As you may be aware, these two months are back-to-back 31 day months, and are so arranged because they're named after two esteemed Roman emperors: Julius Caesar (July) and Augustus Caesar (August). But august is a word in its own right: it means "respected and impressive" according to the respected and impressive Oxford English Dictionary (which no self-respecting grammarian should ever be without in study or in intellectual pursuit, my dear fellow).

Our Youth Gathering in New Orleans was an exciting and memorable experience for all. You could even say it was a rather august event: respected for its ability to draw people together from all over the country and unify them in a single purpose, and impressive for the sheer scope of planning and logistical work needed to pull off the whole thing.

Singing with 16,000 other human beings has a particular effect on the mind, body, and soul. I'd experienced this before, at youth events when I myself was in high school, and then later as an adult at a U2 concert (approximately 8 zillion people all singing "But I still haven't found what I'm looking for" together gave me goosebumps).

Now while the experience at our mass gatherings in New Orleans was impressive, it hopefully directed each of our hearts to something beyond what we could hear and feel and touch (and smell, wowzers! Youth and deodorant are a necessary combination in large group settings). Our hearts and minds were directed toward the obvious reality that God is at work all over the place. "Aslan is on the move" as CS Lewis wrote. We heard about the work of the Holy Spirit from New Orleans to Palestine to Puerto Rico.

Indeed, God is at work in communities all over the world, including here in Sun Prairie. The Holy Spirit is burning like a red hot wind (haven't you We, comforting us in our sorrows, and opening our eyes to the beauty and truth of Jesus Christ once again.

As we prepare for VBS and Corn Fest Parade and the Blacktop Party and our Transition Team's church-wide conversations, we ought to pause and acknowledge the good work going on all around us. Recognize the good work going on inside each of us. And focus our eyes yet again on the august beauty of our Creator and the work to which we are collectively called.

Council Notes from June 17, 2024 Meeting

- t Council and Pastor Peter discussed the Transition Process and the role of the Council in the process.
 - o Shared the congregation hand-out sheets.
 - o Asked the congregation to continually encourage people to participate in the many aspects of the transition.
 - o Spoke about how that will impact the conversations and decisions—information coming from the congregation, budget, program needs.
 - o Discussed that anxiety can rise in a congregation during a transition and that is normal. Our Savior's is in good shape and will have a good outcome.
 - The Transition Team is not tasked with making changes, but gathering the information that could lead to changes.
- Pastor Peter has offered to help create a year-round Stewardship plan for the congregation. He shared some details about the themes that would be addressed in the plan.



A Call to Justice and Mercy (JAM)

The JAM group has been leading classes on **Systemic Racism**. So far we have concentrated on the injustices slavery caused and the legacy of that injustice. 


